Managing challenging behaviors doesn't have to feel overwhelming. This course provides educators with practical tools and positive behavior strategies to respond effectively, reduce disruptions, and strengthen relationships with students. Participants will leave with strategies they can immediately apply to create calmer, more supportive classrooms where all students can thrive.
