This rigorous professional development training program is for candidates interested in pursuing future ISTA staff positions. ISTA strives to celebrate the diversity of our membership and provide opportunities that are inclusive of all members.

Internship Criteria

Level of experience

- Minimum of five years' work experience in an education related field or labor related field
- Minimum of three (3) years of demonstrated union activism. Examples include, but are not limited to:
 - Local, district, state or national committees
 - Participation in the Emerging Leader Cohort
 - Served as an Association Representative, local leader and/or bargaining team member
- Understanding, or familiarity, with fundamental labor principles
- Demonstrated community outreach experience

Intern qualifications

- Strong verbal and written communication skills
- Flexible, dedicated and hardworking
- Understanding of UniServ staff work
- Ability to take personal time to fulfill internship curriculum
- Access to transportation to attend statewide curriculum trainings, conferences, etc.
- Must pass a background check

Application Details

Only candidates that can commit to the internship expectations will be considered. Applicants who are selected to move forward in the process will be scheduled for an in-person panel interview scheduled to take place either Oct. 27 or Oct 28.

The following documents must be submitted with your application. All documents are due no later than **Wednesday, Oct. 1.**

1. Resume

Include the following:

- Education
- Work Experience (full time only)
- Association offices held
- Association committee work
- Experience in any of the following areas:
 - Membership recruitment
 - Organizing
 - Bargaining
 - Social and/or racial justice
 - Other union activities
 - Lobbying/political action
 - Member rights
 - Public speaking

2. References

Provide at least three (3) letters of reference. At least one should be from outside the education profession, such as community or personal contact. All reference letters should highlight your leadership abilities. A UniServ Director or UniServ Organizer may be one of your references.

3. Essay

Include/upload a 500-word essay discussing why you are applying for the ISTA UniServ Intern Program and why you would be an asset to the profession.

Note: Applicants should be aware that if selected for the Internship, they will be required to step down from any governance leadership roles (local, ISTA or NEA) due to the time commitment of this program.
